

## **Sports Premium Funding (Expenditure and Impact Report 2017/18)**

There has been a particular focus on PE in schools in recent years with the introduction of the Sport Premium. Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government has agreed to allocate to schools, initially for two academic years (2013-14 & 2014-15) but which has since been promised for a number of further years, currently to 2020. In 2017-18, the level of funding awarded to schools increased significantly, as a result of the government's sugar tax, on fizzy drinks. The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of primary aged children they have. The 2017-18 Sports Premium funding allocated to Hudson Road primary school was £18,120. The Sports Premium grant is to be used to increase the quality and breadth of study in sports and PE provision. It is also awarded to help schools to improve participation levels in competitive sport.

### **Physical Education improvements at Hudson Road Primary School since our last impact report:**

In the last academic year Hudson Road Primary school has made improving Physical Education and Sport a high priority. As a school we made the following improvements:

- The school achieved the Sainsbury's School Games Gold Award.
- All children continue to take part in at least 2 hours of sport/ PE each week.
- In the last 12 months all pupils from Y1 to Y6 have taken part in individual sports such as gymnastics, dance and athletics during PE sessions. They have also covered competitive team sports, which include football, cricket and rugby.
- All children have taken part in competitive in house competitions as part of their physical education.
- Sports week at Hudson Road School involved all students (Nursery to Year 6) and included healthy eating workshops, Ceilidh dancing and an assault course led by the schools sports leaders.
- Year 5 and Year 6 pupils took part in cluster and city wide tournaments in football and cricket. The school also improved its links to minority sports during sports week, when pupils were introduced to a range of new and exciting sports.
- All children in Year 3 and Year 4 spent at least one term swimming this academic year.
- The school has had over 216 hours of PE coaching in school, which equates to having a coach in school every half-term for the equivalent of one full day per week throughout the year. Children have been able to use this expert input to develop their football, dance, gymnastics, cricket and multi-skills abilities. Further to this teachers and support staff have been able to develop their own practice as a result of working with a range of specialist coaches.
- From next year the events, including CPD, that are being run by the SSP will be displayed on a noticeboard so that staff can see them and express an interest. This is especially important as some teachers are working in new-year groups, and might not know what is on offer for them and their children. We also have NQT's working in school, and attending these events should be an important part of their professional development.

### **Sport Premium funding break down 2017-18**

Initially the Sport Premium was only allocated for two years. As a result, it was considered that the money should not only be used to make a difference to school PE/sport during the current academic year but also in those to come. Much of the impact the money had during the 2016-17 academic year was through the work of coaches in our school and through enhancing the breadth of PE opportunities in school. The remainder, as detailed below, was spent on upskilling our staff in school, to ensure when the money invested in sport comes to an end, all staff will have a better understanding of PE and how to teach it effectively.

### **Sport Premium: 2018-19**

Below is our plan for the use of the Sport Premium next academic year. We expect to receive £18,205. We hope that by identifying these areas for improvement now, we can improve the sporting outcomes for the children in the future.

Additional PE Equipment	£1145	This will enable the delivery of high quality PE provision across the school. The school requires additional money to spend on new PE equipment to ensure a board and balanced curriculum.

Farringdon Sports Cluster Funding	£1500	This will enable school to compete against three other local primary schools. This will allow our children to participate in more level 2 and 3 competitions and will allow school compete in enough different sports to maintain the Gold Award Charter Mark.
AP Sports Coaching	£3435	Coaches will attend school with the aim of up skilling the teaching staff so that next term/year they can plan and deliver their own games and activities to a higher standard. Coaches will work with children at breakfast club and during occasional lunchtimes to improve their sporting fundamentals.  The activities will take place on our KS2 yard for breakfast club activities, on the field for lunchtime activities and in the hall or on the field for PE sessions.
